In World X-Country Trials, John Kavanagh placed 2nd. and Peter Brett 3rd.

Individual Achievements:

Internationally, Yolanda Budich ran 4.37/9.45, placing 4th.in Leipzig(DDR) and 6th.in Wales. She became the third Flinders runner to be offered an AIS scholarship, but she declined .

Peter Brett won the Vastervik(Sweden)Half-Marathon(65) for the second year in a row, was runner-up in Gothenburg's Half-Marathon(65.24) against 27,000 runners, second in the Norway Road Classic(23.46 for 8km), 3rd. in the Odense Half-Marathon(63.50 PB), second in the Enhorna 15km. (44.31) behind Nyambui, 9th. at Lidingo-Lopett 30km. (1.40.26) against 30,000 people and clocked 2.19.54 at the New York Marathon. He was the only SA athlete to be invited to compete on the IAAF Mobil Grand Prix circuit in Europe. He competes on contract for Enhorna-Scania in Scandinavia.

Ben Phillips was 60th.in the Lidingo-Loppett, then trained with Koskei's distance

squad in Kenya for a few months.

Brian Chapman defeated Henry Rono in the San Diego Marathon by a mile (3.48 to 3.55). Flinders placed 3rd. in the Enhorna (Sweden) Road Relay collecting \$500. Members were Paul Collins, Brian Chapman, Ben Phillips and Peter Brett augmented by Garry Henry and Nick Biddeau.

Locally, Yolanda Budich was fastest leg at the Pat Relay and Gawler Relay, won the Half-Case 5km.(17.37), Collonades 10km(36.19/\$400), Airport-TNT(\$250) and Pt.Elliott to Victor. She was also 2nd.in City-Bay as was Allan Carman.

Allan Carman was also fastest leg in the Pat Relay(9.14), set a junior record in the Greenbelt Half-Marathon(66.35) behind Brad Camp and won City-Port(44.54).

Peter Brett won Glendi's \$500, Jonathon Abrahams took the Coober Pedy 12km. (41min/\$250), Brian Chapman prevailed in the Robe 10km. Meredith Ryan dominated the Women's Week World Championship Schoolgirl Fun Run, Jim Mack won Half-Case Half-Marathon(69.21) and Robert Ziersch took the Torrens Discovery 30km.

Yolanda Budich represented Australia in the World Junior Championships in Sudbury, Canada, where she finished 17th. out of 25 in the 10,000m.(38.42). She was our first World Championship female rep.

Peter Brett and John Kavanagh represented Australia in the World Cross-Country Championship in Stavanger, Norway. Brett, in his 4th.consecutive national team (matching DeCastella and Moneghetti's record), placed 96th.(42.55).

Kavanagh finished 20th.in the junior 8km.world title(26.47), a position bettered only by DeCastella, Moneghetti, Steve Austin and Tony Ford among Australian males ever. He was the 4th.non-black African to finish. John followed up by winning the junior Cinque Mulini 7.5km.race(25.19) against 90 Europeans.

Peter Brett then raced the World Cup Marathon in Milan, clocking about 2.26.




